In recent years, the accreditation process by NAAC has become more comprehensive, more scientific, and more nuanced, igniting revolutionary transformations in the world of higher education. The seminar was an attempt at mapping this process, identifying the hurdles to quality enhancement and locating the trajectories to be followed in order to attain quality goals in higher education

2.14. Significant Activities and contributions made by IQAC

- The college was first accredited on 3 May 2004 and in the same year IQAC was established in the institution. The motives behind its establishment are to ensure the highest quality in all areas of academic activity, especially in teaching-learning and evaluation, research and extension. The IQAC works to attain this by closely monitoring the academic performances and processes and intervening, wherever necessary. Under the motivation and guidance of the IQAC, the college undertook a slew of initiatives as part of its prolonged institutional efforts to raise the college ultimately to the level of an institution of excellence. The IQAC noticed a specific lacuna in the functioning of the institution. This lacuna was analyzed as comprising four sectors: lack of exposure, lack of inspiration, lack of motivation and lack of integration with the regional society. On the basis of the advice offered by the IQAC, a series of measures was taken by the institution.
- Most of the departments initiated lecture series in which eminent personalities from India and abroad visited the institution and motivated the students as well as the faculty. To improve the inter-personal relation between students and teachers a number of activities were conducted as part of observance day. A one day national seminar was organised to galvanise the institutional efforts to face the next NAAC reaccreditation process.
- The teachers were urged to submit research proposals from time to time, based on the notification from the websites of various funding agencies. Students were also encouraged to submit project proposals to various state-level and national-level organizations.
- IQAC monitors teachers' performance on the basis of appraisal forms and students feedback.
 Ensures the publication of internal evaluation scores. Remedial measures are also suggested. Also log books for monitoring and teachers diary are maintained.
- Bridge courses are conducted on a yearly basis, for the newly admitted degree students to them familiarise with the various activities of the college.
- Finishing schools are conducted for the graduated students to improve communication skills, presentations skills and group discussion skills.

1.4 Whether there is any revision/update of regulation or syllabi, if yes, mention their salient aspect.

The revision/update of regulation and syllabi is done by the university and it is under the jurisdiction of the university and it updates its regulations and syllabi periodically. Since our college is an affiliated one, we

strictly follow the directions of the university. The university changed its syllabi during the academic year 2010-11 and it introduced the Choice Based Credit and Semester System (CBCSS) from the said academic year onwards. In 2013 the existing regulations were modified by the university based on the recommendations of the syndicate. Indirect grading system was introduced during the year and students were awarded grades on the basis of the marks scored. Notional grading on the basis of marks will be indicated for each semester. Under the scheme 80 marks will be given for end semester evaluation (ESE) and 20 marks will be given for continuous evaluation and the total marks will be converted to base 10. Modifications were also suggested for open courses conducted by the colleges. The question papers are to be prepared and answer sheets need to be evaluated by the respective colleges strictly adhering to the university regulations. The system is more flexible and liberal to the students. In this system the students were given choice in selecting their subjects. Their academic performance is closely monitored and there is evaluation both at the university level and the college level. The creativity of the students is tapped using assignments, seminars and projects etc. The system is more student oriented instead of teacher oriented.

Students are requested to note that making a complaint is serious and therefore they are to use this power in a responsible manner. At the same time, the college assures students that once a complaint is made, it will be treated with sensitivity and confidentiality.

• Women's Grievance Redressal Cell

The Cell is responsible for looking into any complaints filed by students & staff about Woman Grievances at the college. According to the Hon. Supreme Court of India definition of sexual harassment is any unwelcome sexually determined behavior, such as:

- Physical contact and advances
- Demand or request for sexual favors
- Sexually Colored remarks
- Any other unwelcome physical, verbal or non-verbal conduct of a sexual nature

The functions of the cell are to purely safeguard the rights of female students, faculty and staff members of women and also to provide a platform for listening to complaints. The Cell also tries to incorporate hygiene habits and ensure a healthy atmosphere in and around the college. It tries to equip them with the knowledge of their legal rights and redressal of their grievances. To facilitate speedy delivery of justice, meetings are organized regularly. The counseling cell processes oral and written complaints. Time to time the cell conducts seminars and lectures by specialists and eminent personalities to stop violence against women, sexual harassment at work and about health, hygiene etc.

A legal orientation programme for girl students, 'Lustitia', sponsored by National Commission for Women, Government of India, was organized by Women's Grievance Redressal Cell. The Programme was held on 28 and 30 of October 2017 and 1 and 4 of November 2017. The inaugural ceremony, presided over by Prof. Hashimudeen A, Principal of the college, was noticed with the key note address delivered by Sri. R. Sudhakanth, Honorable Sub-Judge, District Legal Service Authority.

The second session was held by the Resource Person Adv. Niza Fazil, on the topic Constitution of India, Fundamental Rights, Fundamental, Duties and Directive Principles of State Policy. The third session on 30th October 2017 was handled by the Resource Person Adv. Seema C. She reflected on the topic Constitutional Provisions for Women Rights, Women Act 1990 and Criminal Law Amendment Act 2013.

The fourth session was led by Adv. Vijaya Kumar on the topic Protection of Women's Rights: Issues and Challenges. It was followed by fifth session which was handled by the

Resource Person Adv. Preethi. She elaborated on the topic Protection of Women's Right and its Accomplishment in Present Scenario.

The sixth session was handled by the Resource Person, Adv. Majida Abdul Majeed on the topic Women's and Girls' Rights in Islam. The valedictory session hogged the limelight with the presence of chief guests Sri. R. Sudhakanth, Sub-Judge, District Legal Service Authority, Kollam and S. Ajeetha Begum Sulthana IPS, Commissioner of Police, Kollam. Prof. Shajitha S., Convener, Women's Grievance Redressal Cell, was the coordinator of the programme.

• Anti-Ragging Cell

Since the constitution of the anti-ragging cell, it designed programmes to create awareness of anti-ragging among the students. Various charts detailing 'Ragging as Crime' and the punishment under various IPC section were displayed in the campus and leaflets regarding antiragging messages were distributed to make the students beware of the pitfalls of ragging. The contact numbers of the office bearers were made available on notice board for their timely need. The students were facilitated with complaint boxes in campus to lodge their complaints.

A special awareness class was arranged for the volunteers of anti-ragging cell. The volunteers made their service for about first three months of each academic year. The committee members paid surprise visit to both campus and hostels during intervals and working hours to interact with students.

• Anti-Sexual Harassment Cell

As per the guidelines of UGC and the Supreme Court an Anti Sexual Harassment Cell has been established to provide a healthy and congenial atmosphere to the staff and students of the Institute. The cell was constituted to meet the four basic objectives:

- a) To develop the guidelines and norms for a policy against sexual harassment.
- b) To develop principles and procedures for combating sexual harassment.
- c) To work out details for the implementation of the policy.
- d) To prepare a detailed plan of action, both short and long term.

WOMEN'S STUDY UNIT

- Women's Studies Unit of the college was set up as a result of University of Kerala, Centre for Women's Studies' response to address Women's concern in Higher Education. Since then, Women's Studies Unit has taken initiative for the development of the women community in the college by conducting various programmes and activities. During the last seven years it has been nurtured and guided by Dr K Nejmi, Associate Professor, Dept of Zoology who brought in various activities for the overall development of the students. From the year 2015 onwards, the club activities have been guided by Ruksana Sulthana A. H., Assistant Professor, Dept. of Commerce. Being one of the earliest clubs in the college, it is inclusively for female students of the college who make for 80% of the students and to draw a positive reactions from them on issues like adolescent health and sanitation, abuse, harassment, exploitation of women, and also to equip them with a socially useful and productive skill. The activities of the unit therefore include workshops, seminars, debates, discussions, film shows and exhibitions that display the creative acumen of the students.
- The unit conducts training programmes on various modes of art and craft. On Saturdays, training is given to the students of the unit on fabric painting, textile printing, glass painting, pot painting, and they are assigned with cross stitch and quick stitch kits to improve their talents. Along with, sessions on sari designing and churidar designing, sequence works on either of the dresses are taught. Students are also encouraged to do bead work, embossing, liquid embroidery and aplica work on cloth of different materials. Designs as well as raw materials are provided for the same. Another main attraction of the classes are muffler making, using the frame and knitting needles.
- Students are also given training on flower making using different materials ranging from fancy papers, socks cloth, organdy cloth and tissue papers. The use of waste papers, polythene covers and bottles for making flowers and baskets, generates in them the idea of reuse of such waste materials into a creative and useful means. This is considered as a best practice in management of such waste materials. Tile work, pot painting and decoration is assigned to students as a take home activity.
- Debates and discussions are conducted on a weekly basis by the students of the unit on local issues and empowerment of women, and these activities are mediated and presided

over by the convener of the unit. Classes were organized on health and hygiene by the unit. The unit has undertaken a cleaning programme as part of Swach Bharat mission, organized by the Kollam Corporation at Peeranki Maidan, Kollam. The unit is looking forward to inculcate more training programmes and other activities for enrichment and enhancement of the female community both mentally and physically.

PLANNING FORUM

• Planning Forum is an academic platform for the students who are interested in the subject of management, Commerce and Development Economics. This ensures enrichment of knowledge of students in this field through activity based programmes. Planning forum helps to create an awareness of the need for planned development of the country among students. It also helps to stimulate interest among the students in intellectual and academic activities by holding debates, organising discussions on economic problems and arranging occasional lectures by public men.

ENVIRONMENTAL CLUB

- The club observed Environmental Day on 13th June 2017 which was notable by the participation of many important dignitaries. Dr. Kunji Krishnan, Associate Professor (Rtd.), Dept of Zoology, delivered a lecture on the topic Man and Nature. Another lecture was delivered by Sri. Madhusoodhanan V.K., Member of Kerala Shasthra Sahithya Parishath on the topic Connecting People to Nature to Stop Sea Level Rise. Tree planting programme was a joint venture conducted in the Campus by members of the Environmental Club and Birds Club in connection with the World Environment Day on 5th June 2017.
- Members actively participated in the cleanliness drive at Peeranki Maidan as part of Swachatha hi Seva on 26 June 2017. Measures have been initiated by the club for renovating the botanical garden in the college campus. Members of the club have also prepared a draft Environmental Protocol for the campus.

BIRDS CLUB INTERNATIONAL

 Keeping in mind the socially magnificent mission of protecting and preserving the nature around us, a unit of Birds Club International (BCI) was formed in the campus, and officially inaugurated on 13.06.2017 by the reputed film maker Sri. Jayaraj. In his inaugural speech, Sri. Jayaraj denoted the importance of planting trees and establishing rain groves for the conservation of birds. The function was presided over by Prof. E. Najeem, Head of the Department of Arabic. The District Coordinator of BCI, Dr. Amina Surya, Associate Professor, M.S.M College, Kayamkulam felicitated the event. The Staff Coordinator of BCI-T.K.M.CAS, Dr. Jasin Rahman V.K., Assistant Professor in Zoology, offered the vote of thanks. Sri. Jayaraj planted tree sapling on the campus and visited the rain grove in the botanical garden in the college.

- As part of the launching of Birds Club International in the college, students of the club planted 50 tree saplings on the campus in the World Environment Day on 05.06.2017.
 Principal Prof. A. Hashimudeen inaugurated the programme by planting the tree sapling.
- Discussions on various topics concerning the conservation of nature and birds were conducted as part of the club. Silpa A.R., Alana Nazeer, Fathima Suhra S. and Ananthakrishnan B. of B.Sc. Zoology were sent to participate in the photo exhibition conducted at St. Gregorios College on 10.11.2017, and organized under the auspices of BCI-Kollam district as part of the National Bird Watching Day. Further, Student members of the club were sent to participate in the 'Asian Water-bird Census' held in various wetlands of Kollam on 13.01.2018. The programme was organized by WWF (World Wide Fund for Nature). The club members also engage in surveying and recording the birds seen in and around the T.K.M. college campus.

STUDENTS SERVICE CELL

• Tutorial System (CBCSS)

A very important feature of the functioning of the college is its tutorial system. The entire student community of the institution is divided on the basis of classes and placed under Faculty Advisors. If a class has more than fifty students, two Faculty Advisors are appointed. The Faculty Advisor gives personal attention and care to each student member of the class. The progress of each student is monitored by him and he takes corrective measures whenever needed after interacting with the parents concerned. The tutorial system is monitored by College level monitoring committee

Special Coaching

The college offers special attention to weaker students especially those coming from socially and economically disadvantaged backgrounds. Regular coaching sessions are held throughout the year for them.

• Career Guidance

Career guidance helps to equip students to survive in the highly competitive world of today. It conducts coaching programmes targeted at the various competitive examinations and invites experts to deliver talks that strengthen student awareness of career possibilities.

Training and Placement Cell

A very active Training and Placement Cell is functioning in the college. The cell extends full support to the students for placement. It conducts coaching classes free of cost for various competitive examinations conducted by UPSC, PSC, scheduled banks etc. TCS, INFOSYS, WIPRO, MRF and other corporate units conduct campus recruitment every year. A mega job recruitment programme was conducted in association with the employment bureau of state government last year.

• Medical Inspection

Every student has to undergo an annual medical inspection conducted by a medical officer appointed by the college. Failure to present oneself for medical inspection will be viewed seriously.

Hostels

The college has two ladies hostels of its own. Ms. Shajitha S. Department of Islamic History is the warden. Besides these, the Trust runs seven hostels for the students of its institutions. There are separate hostels for girls and boys.

Canteen

A canteen functions in the college campus. It provides students and staff with food and snacks at reasonable rates. The canteen has been renovated recently and is presently housed in a spacious building with separate accommodation for staff and students.

Student Chapter of Optical Society of America

The Institution has a student chapter of Optical Society of America which supports academics, research and creates valuable career opportunities.

• Co-operative Society

The society aims at catering to the needs of the staff and the students of the college. The society has moved to spacious premises and its showroom is extremely wellstocked. The items sold include text books, note books, consumer durables and other items. Membership is open to both staff and students.

• Co-operative Credit Society

The society was started in 1988. It conducts chits and extends short-term loans to its members.

• Counselling Centre

The college has a counselling centre to provide counselling to students. The centre conducts counselling sessions to ensure the psychological welfare of the students.

College Union

The college union and its branch associations are meant for the responsible and constructive participation of students. They are to train students in leadership and administration and prepare them for public life. The union will be constituted and will function as per the direction of the Administration.

Film Club

• Film studies have recently emerged into a separate genre of visual studies. It has come out of the fold of literary studies and established a theoretical and narrative framework of its own, and hence most of the universities have started departments for film studies. Keeping in mind the rapidly increasing popularity and significance of film as a genre and text, T.K.M. College of Arts and Science is planning to form a film club. 6.1 State the Vision and Mission of the institution

VISION: The Vision of TKM College of Arts and Science is to achieve supreme excellence in academic and non-academic areas, without compromising on institutional responsibilities to the society as a whole, in particular to the socially and economically disadvantaged sections, with special reference to the region in which the college is located.

MISSION: The College strives continuously to provide an environment for the finest teaching and the finest research in the country and try to evolve into an intellectual and cultural nest for students of diverse ethnic, social, religious and linguistic backgrounds, especially the marginalized sections of the society such as the Muslims and the Dalits.

6.2 Does the Institution have a Management Information System?

The College has a central data-base of students and staff which comprises comprehensive details of the learning and teaching stakeholders of the institution. For the time being, as the number of students is less than 1500, and the number of teaching and ministerial staff together less than 125, there is no plan to implement MIS immediately. However, we are in the process of incorporating certain features of Management Information System for strategic and higher level administration.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

The institution is an aided college affiliated to the University of Kerala. Hence curriculum development does not fall under its power ambit. Curriculum design and development process is undertaken by the University of Kerala and the Kerala State Higher Education Council and our teachers participated in discussions relating to curriculum design, conduct of workshops in our campus and attended workshops organised at other venues and played a crucial role in the process. Above all, the college is strongly represented in various academic bodies of our University like Academic Council and Board of Studies.

 internalize and institutionalize quality and raise the institution to the highest level of
 excellence.
- We carefully follow the admission procedures mandated by the Government of Kerala and the University of Kerala and the procedures are transparent and well advertised.
- With the introduction of the CBCSS, teaching-learning has become more student-centric and interactive. There are 16 Social Extension Activity Clubs to tap the creative energy of the students and shape them into better citizens of our motherland.
- Teacher quality is ensured by appointing the best available faculty, providing a congenial work atmosphere, support for quality enhancement and renewal and recognition for achievement.
- Teacher evaluation is done through student feedback, self-appraisal and informal mechanisms such as peer evaluation, confidential report, parent feed-back, alumnifeed-back etc. and the same is utilised for quality sustenance and enhancement.
- There are specific learning outcomes for the UG and the PG programmes as well as
 for each individual course and the institution utilises all its resources to ensure that
 these outcomes are attained.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

The institution believes that testing and evaluation should not be an activity confined to the end of an academic programme, but a phenomenon parallel to the teaching-learning process. The academic performance of students is constantly evaluated through end semester examination conducted by the University and the evaluation of the answer scripts is usually

carried out in centralised valuation camps. Dates of examinations, valuation camps, announcement of results revaluation details are announced by the University. The continuous evaluation comprises test papers, seminars and assignments. The semester examination schedules are notified by the University. Class tests, which are centrally organised by the college, are notified through the notice board and the public address system. Seminars and assignments, projects play a nodal role in the learning-evaluation process. Internal examination, valuation and result publication dates are fixed by the college as per University calendar and announced through the public address system and published on the notice board.

6.3.4 Research and Development

Research and development and teaching and learning are the two academic processes that raise an institution to intellectual excellence. A vibrant research committee gives leadership and guides the research and development activities of the institution. The major recommendations of the committee are the following-

- a) Every teacher to undergo MPhil or PhD course on a full-time or part-time basis, if she/he does not possess a research degree and according to that teacher registered for PhD course work.
- b) Every teacher to participate and present papers in regional, national and international seminars.
- c) Every teacher having a research degree to initiate steps to become recognized research guide.
- d) Faculty shall be encouraged to undertake a minor or major research project.

To strengthen the research culture and generate a scientific temper among the students we have done the following-

- Initiated to publish A peer reviewed journal TKM Arts College International Journal for Multi-disciplinary Research (TIJMR); first volume of the journal is published with ISSN:2581-6519.
- Printed version of the same is published and the next issue will be published in December 2018.

- Seminars and workshops are organised.
- PG and UG students are motivated to visit research institutions.
- PG and Research students are encouraged to publish their project work.
- The departmental associations of the science department are encouraged to organize appropriate activities.
- The nature club, the environmental club and the science club are inspired to organize appropriate activities.
- Research Consultancy: The instruments ordered with the help of DST-FIST funding are installed and functioning well. The service is extended to students research scholars and faculty of nearby institution on the basis of on nominal fees.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

The major infrastructural facilities of the Institution are as follows-

- Computer centre and Wi-Fi enabled campus.
- Botanical garden
- Reprographic centre.
- Open stage for performing arts.
- Fully equipped sports centre and renovated gymnasium.
- Yoga centre and Open-air theatre.
- Parade ground.
- Swimming pool under construction with UGC aid.
- Air-conditioned conference room with a capacity of 30 seats and an airconditioned digital seminar hall with 300 seats.
- ICT enabled PG and science UG class rooms.
- Well-equipped laboratories.

- 120 desktops, laptops, three over head projectors(OHP) fourteen LCD projectors, one slide projector, three scanners and one digital camera.
- Internet facilities in all departments.
- We have a well equipped, full automated library which has an area of 7.12 sq.mts and
 it holds nearly thirty five thousand books. Its layout includes individual reading
 carrels, lounge area for browsing and relaxed reading, IT zone for accessing eresources, career desk, current affairs desk and newspaper boards. Online Public
 Access Catalogue (OPAC) is available in the library and we have INFLIBNET
- The Institution has a comprehensive overall infrastructural development policy. Whenever the Institution feels that some infrastructure enhancement is needed, the matter is put forward to the college planning committee. There it is thoroughly thrashed out, and given tangible shape. Then the same is discussed at the levels of IQAC and the college council. The decisions are conveyed by the Principal to the Management and the Management acts on the same. The institution attempts to make comprehensive use of the funds for infrastructure development available with the Government of Kerala, UGC and other such bodies.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

The motto of the college in the area of human resource management is "Everything out of every bit". Our college is a very small community which consists of around one hundred staff including the teaching and non-teaching and nearly 1700 students. The optimum utilisation of the teacher's abilities, in the field of teaching, research and extension activities are done without any compromise. In the same way non-teaching staff are the backbone of the administration. So beyond any doubt their time and energy could be utilised. Likewise the contribution of PTA /FSA/FORT also may be counted in the larger interest of the institution.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff Recruitment

The appointment process is strictly according to Government/University/UGC norms and highly transparent. Merit is the sole criterion for appointment without losing focus on social commitment.

6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

In sync with the motto" Learn in order to apply" the college is powered by the conviction that all knowledge has ultimately to manifest itself in practical applications. The institution believes in intensive institute-industry interface.

The college signed an MOU with the Department of Higher Education, Government of Kerala on 2013 for organizing Additional Skill Acquisition Programme (ASAP). The Institution has been very successfully hosting the ASAP summer school every year since then. The college is an institution which is offering various skill development programmes sponsored by the UGC, the University of Kerala and the Government of Kerala.

6.3.9 Admission of Students

As the college is a Government-aided institution affiliated to the University of Kerala, admission to various programmes is strictly based on the norms laid down by the University and the Government of Kerala. The admission process-issuing of application forms, date of interviews, commencing of classes is decided and communicated to the college by the University. The information is made available through the website of the University, newspapers, the visual media and the college prospects. The whole admission process is merit-based and transparent. The University of Kerala and the Government of Kerala have fixed norms for admission as per the table given below:

6.4 Welfare schemes for teaching and non-teaching staff and students:

- TKM College of Arts and Science is more a family than a college. It is part of the larger TKM Group which can be seen as a joint family in which the Arts College is a unit. The welfare of the students and the staff, teaching and non-teaching is of paramount importance to the institution.
- The institution attempts to provide comprehensive financial support to students and about 93% of our students are getting one or other scholarship or fee concession, stipend, financial assistance from the Government, university or from the college. The students of our institution get medical assistance for which a first-aid cell is attached to the Physical Education Department. There is a part time doctor in the service of the college hostels. Since 2017, student's Insurance scheme was introduced at the University level. All the newly admitted UG & PG students were covered in this insurance scheme.
- The college conducted coaching classes for candidates preparing for CSIR, UGC, NET BSRB RRB IES and PSC examinations. Text books and note books were distributed free of cost to needy students and subsidised canteen facilities are available to students. Free noon-meal scheme is available to BPL students. There is a mechanism for taking students who fall ill during working hours, to hospitals and after that to their homes, at the expense of the college PTA.

• All members of the teaching and the non-teaching staff are covered by Provident Fund (PF) benefit, State Life Insurance (SLI) and General Life Insurance (GLI). We have an active staff welfare body, through which financial assistance in the form of credit, contingency assistance etc., are provided at a reasonable interest. They can purchase goods on credit from the college consumer co-operative society. In case of medical emergency amounts are collected from the staff to help the sufferers. Children of the staff are given preference for admission through the management quota in all the institutions of the TKM group.

6.9 What efforts are made by the University/ Autonomous College for Examination Reforms?

As an affiliated college the institution has to be part of the testing and evaluation system drawn up the university. Conducting examinations and its reforms are at present not in the agenda of the college. It is done by the University. But definitely the affiliated colleges also get an opportunity to contribute their part in the examination process and

its reforms. We are doing it by sending our representatives in the various bodies like board of studies, academic councils, senate and syndicate of the University.

6.10 What efforts are made by the University to promote autonomy in the affiliated/constituent colleges?

The state government has been taking various steps to promote autonomy in the affiliated colleges. The Government and the University have invited applications for autonomy from the colleges which got 'A' grade in the NAAC accreditation process. Since our college is accredited with 'A' grade and a CGPA of 3.13, we have applied for autonomy and it is being processed.

6.11 Activities and support from the Alumni Association:

- A pride of the institution is its alumni association which has national and international chapters. The college has an active and vibrant Alumni Association.
 It gives nearly 20 scholarships to the students every year. The other important activities of the alumni association are:
 - It regularly conducts state-level essay competition for arts and science college students every year.
 - It honours PhD awardees and rank holders of the college, staff members on their retirement, outstanding former students in their performance in various fields.
 - o It also contributes to the infrastructure of the college.
 - The alumni association takes the initiative to bring together the former students of the college of various batches under regional chapters.
 - Provides financial aid to construct and donate houses for deserving students.
- Global alumni UAE chapter sponsors scholarship on a yearly basis for outstanding students since 2017-2018.
 - It includes 11 scholarships each worth Rs. 9000/-

6.12 Activities and support from the Parent – Teacher Association

The PTA plays a prominent role in the welfare schemes that are made available to students by the institution. The following are the important activities and support that the PTA provides for the welfare of the college and students:

- 1. The PTA is deeply concerned about the academic achievements of the institution and it organizes the merit day every year in which the toppers among students and the achievers among teachers are honoured.
- 2. It donates money for the infrastructural development of the college.
- 3. It gives awards to the best performing students both in academic and co-curricular activities.
- 4. There is an arrangement in the college for taking students who fall ill, during working hours to hospital and after that to their homes, at the expenses of the college PTA.
- 5. It gives suggestions and recommendations for the infrastructural, academic, cocurricular and cultural development of the college.
- 6. With the help of the PTA we conduct class-wise parents meeting so that it is convenient to us to discuss the behaviour and academic progress of the students with their parents.
- 7. Former teachers association of the college introduced a scholarship scheme since 2014. Every year they distribute scholarship for 2 undergraduate and 1 post graduate students. Each scholarship worth Rs. 5000/-

6.13 Development programmes for support staff

There are various welfare and development schemes made available to the support staff and some of them are as follows-

- 1 They are covered under the Provident Fund (PF), State Life Insurance Scheme(SLI)and Group Insurance Scheme(GIS)
- 2 They get low-interest-loan from the College Co-operative Credit society.
- They get margin-free stationery and provisions from the College Consumer Cooperative Society on credit.
- 4 If any medical emergency arises amounts are collected from the entire staff of the college to help the sufferer.

5 Their children get preferential treatment for admission through management quota in all the institutions of the TKM group of institutions.

6.14 Initiatives taken by the institution to make the campus eco-friendly.

The eco-friendly campus of the institution has been attained through the following measures

- a. The campus is environment friendly and plastic free.
- b. The college functions in a campus in which trees are protected and greenery is maintained.
- c. Carbon neutrality is maintained in the campus since carbon dioxide emitting systems are not used in the campus except in the canteen and in the chemistrylabs.
- d. E-waste management is effectively carried out in the campus since the college practises the buy-back system in the matter of computers and other electronic equipments.
- e. Rain water harvesting.
- f. Waste management is carved out in such a way that there is no eco-damage.
- g. Distribution of saplings with NSS support is done every year.
- h. We have a botanical garden which follows the *insitu* model conservation
- i. We have planted maximum number of saplings in the campus.
- j. Special effort is taken to plant and maintain traditional Kerala trees.

7.1 Innovations introduced during this academic year which have created a positive impact on the functioning of the institution. Give details.

• Noon-meal scheme:

 Free mid-day meal scheme has been organised and the same is a blessing for needy students.

• Lecture Series:

- o *F-Talk* (*Faculty talk*): The department of Mathematics organizes talks for the students and faculty on innovative topics in Mathematics every third Friday of each month. In it, each faculty in the department presents a talk of at least 30 minutes in their turn.
- Departments of Chemistry, Physics, English and Islamic history organize lectures by eminent scientist from India and abroad every year to motivate and encourage students and faculties.

• Bridge course:

 Every year the college conducts bridge course to newly admitted undergraduate students to bridge the gap between higher secondary education and collegiate education.

• Library:

- College library organizes a monthly programme for students and teachers to read and discuss the books and authors.
- Orientation is given to all first year students on the use of library and basic information sources at the beginning of every academic year.

• Adoption of school:

 The college has adopted the 103 year old Perumon Govt. L.P. School and doing all the needful for the renovation of the school.

• Computer literacy:

 Basic computer awareness is being provided to the students of the Government School, Karicode.

• Training Partner

o Additional Skill Acquisition Programme (ASAP):

Additional Skill Acquisition Programme (ASAP) is an ingenious undertaking by the Higher Education and General Education Department, Govt. of Kerala that focuses on delivering skill and value based education to Higher Secondary and Undergraduate students. The programme helps students in enhancing their employability with efficient training and placement support.

The 2017-18 ASAP batch started with five Skill Courses as mentioned below:

- 2. Assistant Fashion Designer- Fashion Designing
- 3. Accounts Executives Receivables and Payables Accounting
- 4. Warehouse Supervisor-Logistics

The ASAP students of T.K.M. College of Arts and Science celebrated the 'Day of Lovers' (Valentine's Day) in a different way. The students along with their coordinator, Dr. Chithra Gopinath and SDE, Ms. Safeena Bai arranged a field visit to the isolated stratum of the society-'Quilon Poor Home'. The programme was named 'Aardram 2018'. The students also collected more than 160 food packets 'Pothichoru' from the college for the inmates. The Principal of the college Prof. Hashimudeen. A, spoke about the importance of accepting and caring the poor and needy. As it was Valentine's Day the students gave them a red rose as a symbol of love, care and acceptance. The students were also prepared for entertaining them with some cultural activities and programmes. The final project presentation of the foundation module was held on February 20,2018 at the college seminar hall. The project was named "Swipe Out", a documentary on Game Addiction. o SRC-NSDT:

T.K.M. College of Arts and Science is an SRC (State Resource Centre) campus affiliated to the National Skill Development Training Programme (NSDT). Through this programme, the institution aims to provide a spanking learning experience to students by offering advanced skill development training in various sections. The main objective of this venture is to make available high quality education to the backward or downtrodden categories.

o CCK:

College has tie-up with Continuing Education, Government of Kerala for joboriented courses.

• Continuing Education

T.K.M. College of Arts and Science is a training partner of the Centre for Continuing Education, Kerala, which is affiliated to the Higher Education Department, Government of Kerala. As a training partner, the institution offers courses which are dedicated entirely to the growth and development of technical education, industry, business and social amelioration.

• Golden Jubilee Civil Service Coaching Centre

o In connection with the golden jubilee celebrations, the institution started a Civil Service Coaching Centre for those students who are aspiring and industrious. Students to this coaching endeavour are selected through aptitude test to ensure their quality and competence. Eligible faculties from the Civil Service Academy of Kerala engage classes. Faculties of this coaching programme include Philip K.K., Unnikrishna Kartha, Umman Varghese, Abdul Safeer, Jithin Krishnan, Sandeep S.Nair, Anand Krishnan, Swaraj S.,Pradeep P.S. and Jith.

• Walk With Scholar Programme (WWS)

O The Walk with a Scholar programme, an innovative programme of the Department of New Initiatives, Government of Kerala, was implemented in the most befitting manner in T.K. M. College of Arts and Science in the academic year 2014-15 and continues its successful journey. It served as the perfect platform to mould the scholars, as envisaged by the WWS-team of the institution. The topics for Internal Mentoring and External Mentoring were chosen after carefully assessing the varied needs of the mentees. Special care was taken to see

- that the aptest ambience was provided for each Internal and External Mentoring session. All sessions were highly beneficial to the Scholars.
- The scholars for this programme were selected on the basis of this interview, merit and interest. Thirty students were selected from various departments. They were grouped into five batches of six students and assigned to the Internal Mentors.
- The Internal Mentors for the programme were selected by the College Council.
 The sessions for Internal Mentoring were arranged by the Internal Mentors and their Mentees, according to their conveniences without affecting the regular classes of the Mentees.
- o In a meeting of WWS-team, External Mentoring topics and the External Mentors were identified and special care was taken to assure that the External Mentors were from different disciplines. External Mentoring sessions were arranged in such a way that the Mentees could overcome their weaknesses such as stage fear, mother tongue interference, and psychological problems.
- External Mentoring sessions were started on the first Saturday of February 2017. All External Mentors took a keen interest in the programme and their special care helped the scholars to overcome their weaknesses. Tremendous emphasis was taken to motivate and create greater confidence among the Mentees, so as to equip them to meet the needs of future opportunities.
- O WWS of TKM College conducted a motivational visit to Indian Institute of Science, Central Silk Technological Research Institute, Hindustan Aeronoutics Limited Museum and Visvesvaraya Industrial and Technological Museum, at Bangalore from 23/03/2017 to 25/03/2017. A total of 25 members comprising of 22 scholars and three faculty members from various departments of the college were part of the team.

• Scholar Support Programme (SSP)

The Government of Kerala had launched the Scholar Support Programme(S.S.P.) in all government and aided colleges. The Scholar Support Programme envisages extending support to students of undergraduate level with timely assistance in terms of tutorials, additional lectures, interactive sessions, question banks and study materials. Students who have obtained less than 60% marks in qualifying

examination or in any subject for each semester can join for the Scholar Support Programme. Feedback of students and their performance will be reviewed. The programme is implemented by the Directorate of Collegiate Education. Funds have been allotted for the implementation of the programme for fifty selected students of the college. The S.S.P. programme in T. K. M. College of Arts Science was started in the academic year 2016-2017. The programme definitely helps the backward students score good marks in the examinations.

• Career Guidance and Training and Placement Cell

The Training and Placement Cell, TKM College of Arts and Science, plays a crucial role in locating job opportunities for Under Graduate and Post Graduate students passing out from the college. The number of students placed through the campus interviews is continuously rising. On invitation, many reputed industries visit the institution to hold interviews. We have been successful in maintaining our high placement statistics.

The Placement Cell organizes career guidance programmes and Public Sector Exam Training for students who are interested to join Government Sectors. Employability Centre, Kollam, selected our college in the year 2017 as venue of the Mega job fair "Disha" and they are visiting our college every year for conducting Placement Training programmes and Campus Interviews.

TKM College of Arts and Science Placement Cell have sent more than 30 students from B.Sc Chemistry and M.Sc chemistry to an interview for the post of Quality Analyst in the firm ATLANTIC CARE CHEMICALS. T.K.M. Arts and Science College Training and Placement Cell has sent more than 20 students from M.Sc Chemistry and M.Sc Bio chemistry to an interview for the post of Programme Coordinator in the company 'OMICS INTERNATIONAL'

• Massive Online Open Courses (MOOCs)

O The Spoken Tutorial Project: The Spoken Tutorial Project is the initiative of the National Mission on Education through Information and Communication Technology (ICT), launched by the Ministry of Human Resource and Development of India. The Spoken Tutorial Project was developed by IIT Bombay for MHRD, Govt of India. In connection with this project, IIT-Bombay provides several fruitful online courses for college students all over India. After the completion of the online courses, IIT-Bombay issues certificates for the successful candidates who have gone through the online examination. T.K.M.

College of Arts and Science has also taken initiative to the online courses from this academic year onwards. Thirteen students of the final year Bsc Mathematics have successfully completed two courses (LaTex, Geogebra) of the spoken tutorial project.

• Oratoria Lecture Series

Oratoria Lecture Series, jointly organized by the department of English and the literary club of the college, and sponsored by the Kerala Youth Commission, is a golden feather in the crown of the institution. The main objective of the lecture series is to equip the students with the literary and the cultural texts outside the realm of the syllabi. The first lecture in the series entitled The Emergence of Kerala Modernity was delivered on 2 November 2017 by Dr. P.K. Rajasekhran, the renowned Malayalam literary critic and the news editor of the Mathrubhoomi. Dr. Madhu Vasudevan, reputed Malayalam lyricist, poet and Oscar nominee for Original Song made the second lecture in the oratoria lecture series on 24 November 2017. His lecture titled Evolution of Malayalam Film Songs through Ages: Aesthetic and Cultural Perspective stole the hearts of the audience as it dealt with a topic that is both popular and marginalized.

• Easria Lecture Series

Easria lecture series is organized by the department of Islamic History to provide the students with a thorough knowledge and awareness on contemporary issues and other topics of relevance from inside and outside the texts. The first lecture was delivered on 2nd November 2017 by Prof. Ashraf Kadakkal, Assistant Professor in Islamic History, University of Kerala on the topic "Negotiating the Future of Islamic Law-The Indian Background," a talk based on the contemporary issues faced by the Muslim community. The second lecture in the series was delivered by Dr. Shajila Beevi S., Assistant Professor, Department of Islamic History, Maharajas College, Ernakulam on the topic "Research Methodology: Approaches and Techniques." The talk mainly focused on instilling textual awareness on first and sixth semester degree students.

• Innovative Lecture Series in Chemistry

 The department of Chemistry, T.K.M. College of Arts and Science, organized the fourth distinguished lecture on the topic Separation Techniques in Chemistry on 26 September 2017. The lecture aims at quality enhancement of teaching and research activities by creating new opportunities for academic fraternity to listen to established scientists with outstanding contributions to science and technology.

• Infinity Lecture Series

The new initiative of the department of Physics, Infinity Lecture Series, focuses diligent attention on developing scientific enthusiasm among students, and providing a platform for the undergraduate and postgraduate students to interact with the various scientific personalities in India. The first lecture in this series was delivered by Prof. D. Indumathi, Institute of Mathematical Sciences, Chennai on What We Can Learn from India Based Neutrino Observatory. In this talk, she explained the scientific importance of India's mega science project, "India Based Neutrino Observatory" (INO).

• Extension and Outreach Activities

- Training Programme on Motivation and Personality Development: A training programme on Motivation and Personality Development was organized on 10 November 2017 under the auspices of Human Rights Forum and Entrepreneurship Club.
- Women's Cell of the College has organised three pertinent programmes during the academic year 2017- 2018. These programmes were sponsored by the National Commission for Women, Government of India. The formal inauguration of Mithra Women's Cell Unit of T.K.M. College of Arts and Science, was held on 27th January 2018 at College Seminar Hall. Mithra Women's Cell, was formally inaugurated by Smt. J. Mercy Kutty Amma, Hon'ble Minister for Fisheries, Harbour Engineering and Cashew Industry. Kalaalaya Jyothi is an awareness programme for women's safety and self defence jointly organized by Women's Cell, T.K.M. College of Arts and Science and Kerala Women's Commission on 22 February 2018. The programme was inaugurated by Smt. Shahida Kamal, Honourable Member, Kerala Women's Commission. A legal orientation programme for girl students, Lustitia, sponsored by National Commission for Women, Government of India, was organized by Women's Grievance Redressal Cell. The Programme was held on 28 and 30 of October 2017 and 1 and 4 of November 2017.
- Women's Grievance Redressal Cell: In order to maintain safety and security to girls and women, a cell has been constituted for redressal of grievances. Our Women's Grievance Redressal Cell stays alert all the time to prevent any sexual

abuse towards the students and female staff. If the students face any harassment from the staff or other students, they can lodge complaint at women's grievance cell. In addition, there is a complaint cum redressal committee, which resolves the grievances of the students on the campus. Besides, there is an exclusive mechanism to address the issues relating to women and their grievances.

- Healthcare programmes, garment making units, constructed and donated houses for poor, deserving families, educational scholarships for children from backward communities and SC/ST, promoting vegetable farming in adopted villages in the vicinity of the college. The Community Service Cell is functioning in the college to monitor all these social commitments.
- Steps are being taken to organise research consultancy in the institution. The
 necessary instruments have been ordered with the help of DST-FIST funding.
 Consultancy is scheduled become operative in the next academic year.
- A research tie-up with a fellow of Stanford University has already been initiated in this area. This must be strengthened.
- College has tie-up with Continuing Education, Government of Kerala for joboriented courses
- College has tie-up with CACEE, University of Kerala for conducting continuingeducation courses
- Kerala Resource Centre affiliated to National Skill Development Institution Skill based job oriented courses
- Golden Jubilee Civil Service Coaching Centre

In connection with the golden jubilee celebrations, the institution started a Civil Service Coaching Centre for those students who are aspiring and industrious. Students to this coaching endeavor are selected through aptitude test to ensure their quality and competence. Eligible faculties from the Civil Service Academy of Kerala engage classes.

7.2 Provide the Action Taken Report (ATR) based on the plan of action decided upon at the beginning of the year.

• The proposals to enhance all present UG departments to PG departments submitted to university/government for approval is still under processing.

- With the support of various extension clubs, the college conducted a number of social
 welfare activities. Which includes drinking water projects in the adopted village,
 helping the blind, adoption of the Govt. LP School, Perumon, dress and fund donation
 to Gandhibhavan inmates, etc.
- Revised detailed project report is submitted to the state project directorate, RUSA for the sanction of Rs. 2 crore which will be utilized for the construction of research block and improvement of infrastructural facilities.
- The technology based teaching was made mandatory for PG classes and the students were also encouraged to present their project works using power point. The students were also familiarised with the various online courses and resources to equip them to cop up with the recent advancements in their respective field.
- Around 2000 books were newly added to the existing resources of the library. In addition, access to advanced reading is provided through e-resources and e-journals.
- Students are given training well in advance to prepare them for university/state/national level cultural and sports competitions.
